
Campaign Story Colouring Booklets

Included in our resources this year is a colouring booklet that tells the story of the Moose Hide Campaign. This resource comes in two versions:

- With Story Text: Perfect for reading aloud as a class while students colour, or for independent reading and engagement.
- Without Text: A great option for more advanced learners. After hearing or watching the story—either through our <u>animated video</u> or a group reading of the booklet—students can write the story in their own words, reflecting their understanding and personal voice.

Both versions are available in two formats:

- Full-Size Booklet: One page per image. Ideal for group readings or as individual, detailed colouring pages.
- Mini Booklet: Four images per page. Great for quick activities or take-home booklets.


This special page includes blank signs for students to fill in. Use this activity to encourage students to:


- Think deeply about the message of Moose Hide Campaign Day

- Reflect on what they want others to know or do in support of ending gender-based violence or spreading good medicine (love and kindness)!




Tobacco Tie Colouring Page & Activity

We hope these resources help you and your students connect with the heart of the Moose Hide Campaign in a creative and personal way. Thank you for standing with us.












































THE MOOSE GAVE HIS LIFE SO THAT WE COULD HAVE HIS MEDICINE.
























TOBACCO TIE ART PROJECT

FOR ALL GRADE LEVELS



Tobacco is one of the four sacred medicines in many Indigenous cultures and is used in ceremonies and offerings to give thanks and to bring our prayers or thoughts to our ancestors or to creator.


A tobacco tie is a small bundle of tobacco wrapped in cloth, often given to someone or offered to the land as an act of gratitude, respect, and intention. We often use red cloth as some Nations believe red to be the colour our ancestors can best see.

This colouring sheet features a tobacco tie and invites you to approach it with care and thoughtfulness. As you create your artwork, take a moment to reflect deeply on who or what you are grateful for. Use your creativity to honour that person, place, or experience.

We encourage you to treat this activity with the same care and respect as you would if you were creating a real tobacco tie. Let your artwork carry good thoughts, gratitude, intention and positive energy.
