Perfect for learners seeking inspiration and a deeper understanding of Indigenous perspectives through the universal language of music.

We invite students to think about the music they listen to and for educators to facilitate a conversation with the following questions. Are any of their favourite songs ones that were created to make change or raise awareness? Can they think of any songs that have an important message in them?
